1. INTRODUCTION

In-kind contributions is a program implemented by Good Neighbours Australia (ABN: 95 510 669 822). Good Neighbours Australia solicits and accepts in-kind contributions that are consistent with its mission and that support its core programs, as well as special projects.

The role of in-kind contributions is to support the overall purposes of Good Neighbours Australia through provision of donated goods, services or time. These donations may be used for a specific purpose, or may be used to aid and support the overall purpose and mission of the organisation.

2. OBJECTIVES

The objective of this Policy is to:

- a) Provide information about the policies and procedures of Good Neighbours Australia Gift Acceptance Policy;
- b) Provide an example list of suitable and unsuitable in-kind contributions; and
- c) Provide donors with Good Neighbours Australia Gift Agreement Form to submit an in-kind contribution.

3. GIFT ACCEPTANCE POLICY

3.1 Definition of In-Kind Contribution

For the purposes of this policy, an in-kind contribution is defined as:

'Any non-monetary contribution that is offered to an organisation without benefit given to the donor. This contribution can include the donation of tangible objects, such as goods, or the donation of intangible objects, such as services and time contributions.'

3.2 Acceptance of Goods

An in-kind contribution of goods to Good Neighbours Australia includes, but is not limited to providing:

- a) Equipment;
- b) Books;
- c) Clothing;
- d) Furniture;
- e) Electronics;
- f) Advertising and marketing tools;
- g) Supplies; and
- h) General goods that may serve the overall purpose of the association.

3.3 Acceptance of Services and Time

An in-kind contribution of services to Good Neighbours Australia includes, but is not limited to providing:

- a) Voluntary commitments;
- b) Professional advice and expertise;
- c) Fundraising event support;
- d) Advertising and media placement services;
- e) Market research;
- f) Strategic services;
- g) Photographing services;
- h) Printing services;
- i) Providing general assistance and support;
- j) Supporting organisation projects; Information technology services; and
- k) General services that may serve the overall purpose of the association.

3.4 Acceptance from Entities

Good Neighbours Australia may accept in-kind contributions from entities, including but not limited to:

- a) Corporations;
- b) Small businesses;
- c) Charities;
- d) Foundations;
- e) Government agencies;
- f) Vendors;
- g) Universities; and
- h) General entities that wish to make an in-kind contribution to Good Neighbours Australia.

Good Neighbours may also accept anonymous in-kind contributions provided that it is made in line with the Gift Agreement Form requirements.

3.5 In-Kind Contribution Thresholds

Good Neighbours Australia reserve the right to not accept in-kind contributions that are:

- a) Deemed to be inappropriate to the overall purpose of the organisation;
- b) Deemed to be damaged or impaired; or
- c) Any other reason Good Neighbours sees fit to deny the acceptance of an in-kind contribution.

3.6 Submission of In-Kind Contributions

Any entity wishing to make an in-kind contribution to Good Neighbours Australia must complete a Good Neighbours Australia In-Kind Contribution Agreement Form, with the Form signed by the donor entity or its Representative.

3.7 Recognition of In-Kind Contributions

Any entity that makes an in-kind contribution of property or monies to Good Neighbours Australia will be provided with a Good Neighbours Gift Acknowledgment Form.

3.8 Processing of In-Kind Contributions

Good Neighbours Australia may process an in-kind contribution by:

- a) Conducting an internal review of in-hand contributions;
- b) Seeking legal/financial advice as to whether the in-kind contribution is appropriate for the purpose of the organisation;
- c) Assessing the value of in-kind contributions;
- d) Reporting; and
- e) General duties that help to determine the overall purpose and use of the in-kind contribution for Good Neighbours Australia.

When considering whether to solicit or accept in-kind contributions, Good Neighbours Australia will consider the following factors:

- a) Values - whether the acceptance of the donation compromises any of the core values of Good Neighbours Australia;
- b) Compatibility - whether there is compatibility between the intent of the donor and the organisation's use of the donation;
- c) Benefit - whether the donation benefits the organisation as a whole and our mission; and
- d) Form of gift - whether the gift is offered in a form that Good Neighbours can use without incurring substantial expense or difficulty.

All decisions to solicit and/or accept potentially unsuitable donations will be made by the Good Neighbours Australia Committee.

3.9 Dissolution Clause

In the event of dissolution of the organisation, Good Neighbours Australia reserves the right to redistribute in-kind contributions in the way that the Executive Committee deems fit.

4. EXAMPLES OF SUITABLE DONATIONS

The following list constitutes examples of acceptable and suitable donations that Good Neighbours Australia welcomes, but is not limited to:

- a) Educational material, including books, stationery supplies,
- b) Equipment that will aid and assist Good Neighbours Australia in achieving their mission;
- c) Electronics, including laptops, printers;
- d) Vehicles;

- e) Medicines, including vitamins, vaccines, and nutrition kits which have been approved by the relevant health authorities;
- f) Software, including computer programs, accounting programs, or any software deemed suitable for our organisation; and
- g) General donations that assist the overall purpose and aim of the association.

5. EXAMPLES OF UNSUITABLE DONATIONS

The following list constitutes examples of unacceptable and unsuitable donations that Good Neighbours Australia does not welcome:

- a) Damaged goods;
- b) Goods that are irreparable;
- c) Hazardous goods;
- d) Radioactive goods;
- e) Plants;
- f) Drugs and illegal substances;
- g) Goods related to child labor;
- h) Goods related to illegal activities;
- i) Goods that violate general social standards or ethics; and
- j) General donations that do not assist the overall purpose and aim of the association.

6. INDEMNITY CLAUSE

No Warranties. Good Neighbours Australia, including its officers, employees, and agents, make no representations whatsoever, extend no warranties of any kind, either express or implied, including but not limited to the implied warranties of merchantability or fitness for a particular purpose, and assumes no responsibilities whatsoever with respect to design, development, manufacture, or use of the in Kinds Contribution. Furthermore, in no event shall the Good Neighbours Australia be liable for direct, indirect, special, consequential, incidental or punitive loss, damage or expenses arising out of or in connection with this agreement, including but not limited to recipient's use of the assets or removal of the assets from the Good Neighbours Australia premises or any place Good Neighbours Australia stores the in kind contributions from time to time.

The recipient acknowledges and agrees to be bound by the attached indemnity agreement.

Liability Clause

In consideration for accepting the In-Kind Contributions, _____ agrees to the following waiver of liability and indemnity provisions:

1. Receipt of Assets. _____ acknowledges receipt of the following assets in-kind contributions by Good Neighbours Australia to _____

2. No Warranties. Good Neighbours Australia, including its officers, employees, and agents, make no representations whatsoever, extend no warranties of any kind, either express or implied, including but not limited to the implied warranties of merchantability or fitness for a particular purpose, and assumes no responsibilities whatsoever with respect to design, development, manufacture, or use of the in Kinds Contribution. Furthermore, in no event shall the Good Neighbours Australia be liable for direct, indirect, special, consequential, incidental or punitive loss, damage or expenses arising out of or in connection with this agreement, including but not limited to recipient's use of the assets or removal of the assets from the Good Neighbours Australia premises or any place Good Neighbours Australia stores the goods from time to time.

3. Waiver of Liability. _____ does hereby waive, release and discharge any and all claims for damages for personal injury, death, property damage, any claim in tort, or any other claim, regardless of legal theory, that may hereafter accrue as a result of the use of the in-kind contribution. The entire risk as to the performance of the in-kind contributions is assumed by _____. In no event shall the Good Neighbours Australia or its officers, employees or agents, be responsible or liable for any direct, indirect, special, incidental, consequential damages, lost profits, or any other economic or physical loss or damage to any individual regardless of legal theory resulting from use of the in-kind contribution. The above limitations on liability apply even though the Good Neighbours Australia may have been advised of the possibility of such damage.

4. Indemnification. _____ agrees to indemnify and hold harmless the in-kind contribution donors from any and all claims, liability and damages, arising from the use of the in-kind contribution except those arising from the sole negligence or wilful misconduct of the Good Neighbours Australia.

"Donor" is aware that acceptance and disposition of contributions/services are governed by the policies of Good Neighbours Australia and is subject to change in the events of unforeseen circumstances without further notice to the donor.
